Additional \$10,000.00 Grant Awarded for EYELIGHT Research Project

As reported in the May issue of the WISE Newsletter, Dr. Jacob Liberman and Kent Noonan were awarded a large grant of \$35,000.00 through the WISE Research Grant and Funding Program. This grant was awarded by a private foundation for the purposes of conducting research on the EYELIGHT Project being conducted by Dr. Liberman, Kent Noonan, and others. Because of the great potential for enhancing human health and healing, Dr. Liberman and his team have just been awarded an additional \$10,000.00.

The EYELIGHT Project is developing a unique light based technology to assess and enhance wellness, revolutionizing our understanding of how light interacts with the human body. First WISE Research Branch Established in India

We are proud to announce that the first of several planned WISE research branches in India has recently been established in the major Indian city of Chennai (formerly known as Madras) in the state of Tamil Nadu, in southeastern India.

This branch is being headed by Dr. Shanmugamurthy Lakshmanan, who has a Ph.D from the New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT), and three masters degrees, in science, philosophy, and the arts. Dr. Lakshmanan was the founder of the International Institute of Human Excellence in Nilgiris, Tamil Nadu, India, and was also the founder of the New Jersey branch of the World Community Service Center, which is headquartered in Tamil Nadu. In addition, Dr. Lakshmanan is a board member of the Human and Animal Welfare Association in Chandigar, India, and a trustee of the Simplified Kundalini Yoga (SKY) Trust in Tamil Nadu, and in 2005 registered SKY-USA as a nonprofit organization.

Chennai, with a population of more than 8 million, is not only one of the major industrial cities of India, but also a well established center of learning, research, and culture. Chennai has more than twenty universities and colleges, including four medical schools. In addition, there are numerous research institutes in Chennai, including a branch of the US National Institutes of Health (NIH), which established an International Center for Excellence in Research in Chennai several years ago.

National Complementary, Alternative, and Traditional Medicine Library (NCATML) Is Established

Doing research on and practicing complementary, alternative, and traditional medicine therapies is one of the major activities of WISE members worldwide. In order to help facilitate that research, WISE has decided to establish both a hard copy and digital National Complementary, Alternative, and Traditional Medicine Library (NCATML).

The NCATML will function not only as a valuable research resource for all WISE members, but it will also function as a repository and archive where the collections of living or deceased researchers can be preserved. In addition, the NCATML will also be able to preserve the collections of defunct organizations and periodicals in the alternative and traditional medicine fields.

WISE Digital Anomalies Library (DAL) Update

As we announced in the June, 2012 newsletter, the World Institute for Scientific Exploration (WISE) has established a **Digital Anomalies Library (DAL)** to complement the hard copy **WISE National Library of Anomalies Literature**. Most of the hundreds of anomalies periodicals that have been published over the years are out of business or otherwise very hard to find, since few libraries subscribed to such periodicals.

One such periodical is **Pursuit**, published by the Society for the Investigation of the Unexplained (SITU) from 1967-1989, with a total of 85 issues. This periodical is found in only 20 libraries in the world, including 19 widely dispersed US libraries, and one library in Alberta, Canada, and most of these libraries do not have complete sets of **Pursuit**. Because of those factors that would make accessing a complete set of Pursuit so difficult, and the fact that Pursuit had so many interesting articles on anomalies subjects of all kinds, it was decided to make the digitization of Pursuit as the pilot project for periodicals in the Anomalies Digital Library.

A complete set of **Pursuit** issues has been assembled with the help of Dr. Michael Swords, and they will shortly be taken to a commercial digitizing company where they will be digitized and put on a CD or DVD and be made available to the world. This should be completed sometime in September, 2012.

But **Pursuit** is just the first of dozens of anomalies periodicals that WISE plans to digitize, and we will also be digitizing dozens of complementary, alternative, and traditional medicine periodicals as well.

We do not want to duplicate other's efforts, however, by spending precious time and money digitizing things that have already been digitized. We would, therefore, like to request that all people check their hard drives, CDs, and any databases they have access to and let us know if they find any periodicals that have already been digitized related to anomalies, complementary, alternative, or traditional medicine, parapsychology, or paranormal subjects of any kind.

1. **Research Grant and Funding Service:** With this service, WISE enables and helps its members to apply for and acquire research grants, research contracts, and other funding for their research projects. For example, WISE has recently helped members to receive research grants of US \$35,000.00, \$10,000.00, and US \$5,000.00, with other grants and funding in the works.
2. **Publishing Services Benefits:** WISE has established a program to help researchers, authors, and writers to get their articles prepared for publication and then published in journals and periodicals, and made available for the world to see online. We want to enable anyone in the world to publish his or her research and other creative works, without the traditional frustrations and impediments to publication that authors have historically faced, especially researchers and authors in developing nations, who have sometimes been discriminated against by editors and peer reviewers of journals published in Western countries.
3. **CV-Resume Enhancement Benefits:** All WISE “members” are not just members of an organization, but have the official status of Directors, Faculty members, Research Scientists, Fellows, Advisors, Researchers, and Research Associates, depending on their prior accomplishments and appointments within WISE. As such, WISE members can note their position on their resume or CV, on business cards, letterheads, on job applications, or in other appropriate places.
4. **Compensation and Commissions:** All WISE members can earn extra money for themselves, because for every new WISE member you recruit to WISE, you will be paid US\$20.00. 8. **Anomalies Literature Preservation Program (ALPP):** WISE has established an Anomalies Literature Preservation Program to track down, acquire, and preserve personal and organization collections and libraries of anomalies literature, alternative and traditional medicine literature, parapsychology, and related literature. Many collections are at risk for loss, especially the collections and files of defunct or dying organizations and periodicals, as well as, the collections of people who have passed away.

Library System, through the **International Coalition of Anomalies Libraries and Collections (I-COALC)**, and through the **International Coalition of Complementary, Alternative, and Traditional Medicine Libraries and Collections (ICCATMLC)** will attempt to preserve such at risk collections, as well as provide a place where individuals can have their personal collections and papers preserved.

9. **Professor Research Assistance Program to (PRAP):** WISE has recently established the Professor Research Assistance Program (PRAP) to help busy professors with their research on scientific anomalies, alternative and traditional medicine, parapsychology, and research in other anomalies field with their research. Professors are notorious for having many ongoing projects, but too little time or help to do them. And this is especially so with research on the above subjects, where the professor can expect little or no help or sympathy from his or her university department. So with this program, WISE will help find volunteers who can assist professors with their most daring research projects.
10. **Author Research Assistance Program (ARAP):** WISE has also established an Author Research Assistance Program (ARAP) to help authors of books and articles on scientific anomalies, alternative medicine, parapsychology, and related subjects. Research materials on such subjects is frequently difficult to find, since such literature is often not in even the largest of libraries, and may not be indexed in even the most comprehensive indexes of conventional scientific, and social science literature. Authors therefore frequently need specialized research assistance, which WISE will help to provide.
11. **Digital Anomalies Library (DAL) to Complement the WISE Library and Archives:** WISE has established a Digital Anomalies Library to complement its existing large library of several thousand books and periodicals on anomalies, alternative and traditional medicine, parapsychology, and other subjects. WISE has also begun to digitize anomalies journals and periodicals in order to make this literature available to researchers around the world.
12. **International Coalition of Anomalies Libraries and Collections (ICOALC)** and the **International Coalition of Complementary, Alternative, and Traditional Medicine Libraries and Collections (ICCATMLC)**, established to preserve collections rescued from defunct organizations and periodicals, and deceased people, as well as, collections of living individuals who would like to have their collections preserved.

And this is just the beginning. We have numerous other valuable programs and projects in the works, especially the **WISE Online Encyclopedia**, similar to Wikipedia, but without their very biased approach to anomalies, alternative medicine, parapsychology, and related subjects. This will cover every anomalies and alternative medicine subject, organizations, periodicals, books, articles, and people doing research or interested in scientific anomalies. All will have their own page in the **WISE Online Encyclopedia**. **Also**, please let us know of any other programs or benefits that you would like to see WISE establish. 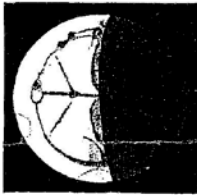

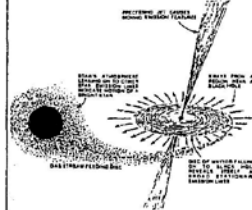

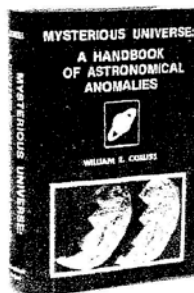
